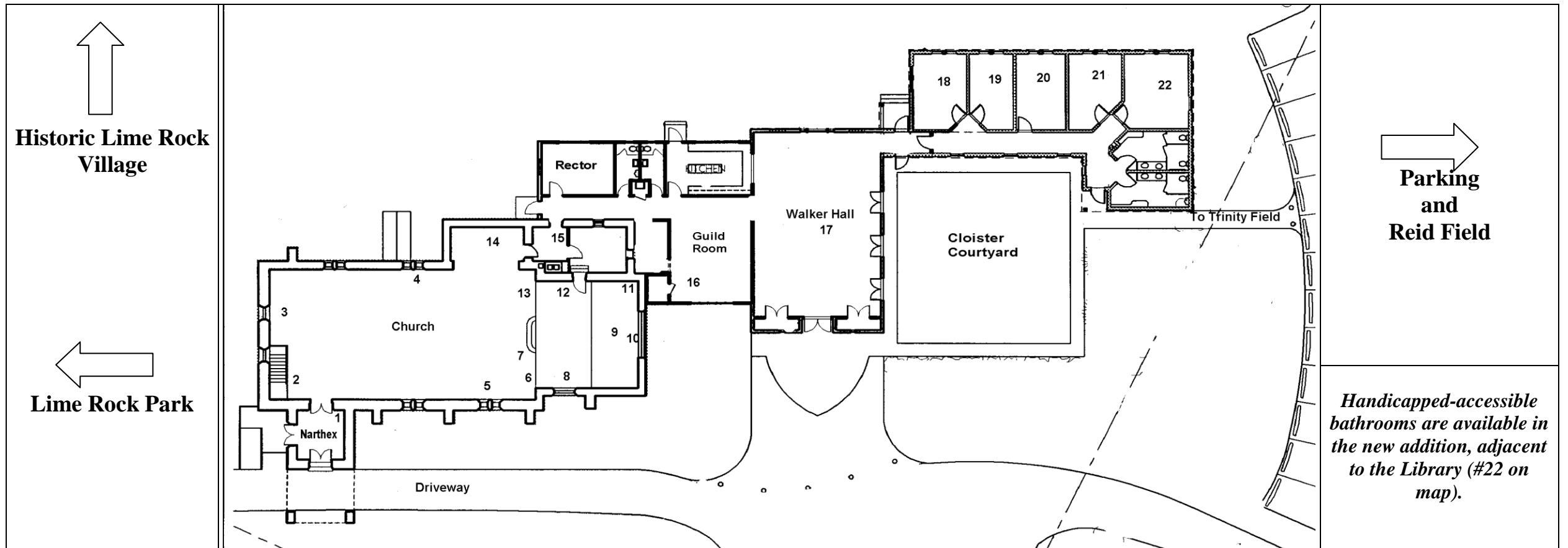


A self-guided Tour of Trinity Episcopal Church, Lime Rock



KEY TO NUMBERS:
Numbers located in the church building, constructed in 1873:

1. Narthex: Bell above (donated by the Richardson family), and visitors' book. **Please sign!**
2. Stairs to undercroft, once the parish hall (*currently closed to visitors*).
3. Richardson family windows, memorial processional crosses, memorial book.
4. Windows of St. Lydia of Philippi and St. Dorcas, in memory of Eleanor Rowles Gaylord.

5. Faith and Hope windows, memorials to Ensign and Goodwin families.
6. Pulpit, in memory of Lucy Caroline Richardson Harwood.
7. Baptismal font and cover in memory of Helen Gilbert, granddaughter of Charles W. Barnum.
8. Mary Magdalene window, the gift of Mrs. W. H. Barnum in memory of her mother, Lucy Beach Burrall.
9. Altar & reredos, in memory of Lucy Ann Richardson.
10. Altar windows, in memory of Walter Phelps.

11. Memorial Sanctus bell, Sanctus lamp, Aumbrey, and Bishop's seat.
12. Rodgers organ console (3 manuals, 96 stops, digital), installed 2001.
13. Eagle lectern, in memory of Senator William H. and Charlotte Barnum.
14. Chapel (currently under development – originally the site of the Johnson pipe organ)
15. Passage (note the framed documents about the founding of Trinity).

Numbers located in Walker Hall, constructed in 1962:

16. Guild Room (note the Barnum plaque,

- identifying W. H. Barnum as “a founder of Trinity Church”).
17. Walker Hall, named for the Rev. Milledge Walker, first Rector of Trinity. Restored as part of the 2004 construction project. Reid Field is visible through the French doors.

Numbers located in our new addition, constructed in 2004:

- 18-22. Administration, Sunday School and Library space. Note the reproduction of the original Trinity Cross at the end of the cloister hallway.

Handicapped-accessible bathrooms are available in the new addition, adjacent to the Library (#22 on map).
