## FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK:

When your vestry met this Spring at Trinity Retreat Center in Cornwall, we spent quite a bit of time talking about what was most important to us as a parish.



Our Junior Warden, Pari Forood led us in this and recorded what we all felt. We asked “what is our mission?” We pondered this question so that when we make decisions in vestry meetings we can keep in mind what we have deemed to be the most important things to us. We wished to flesh out our mission statement; *Offering Companionship Along the Way*.

Here are the elements that the vestry identified as most important to our parishioners and our identity as Trinity Episcopal Church, Lime Rock (in order of our thought process, not in order of importance):

- 1.) *Helping Individuals* – We offer companionship, spiritual support, and food and aid for each other, and for those in need.
- 2.) *Being Family* – We help each other remember that we are not alone, and that we find strength, hope and love through our fellowship with each other.
- 3.) *Our Liturgy and Ritual* – The weekly experience of Word and Sacrament keeps us connected with Christ and gives us spiritual comfort.
- 4.) *Tolerance of Many Differences* – We come from many backgrounds and points of view, and we accept

one another, and invite others to know that they are accepted by God and the Church.

5.) *Support of Church Mission* – We recognize that we are not a church unto ourselves but are connected to the wider Episcopal Church and the mission of our ECCT (Episcopal Church in Connecticut), and of the TEC (The Episcopal Church).

6.) *Educational and Spiritual Growth* – We provide opportunities for learning to every parishioner through Bible Study, and our Book Study groups, as well as Christian education for young people.

7.) *We have a long history and tradition* – We are rooted in the very fabric of our community, and the history of the Christian faith. We share traditions that are 8 years old (Christmas Tree Lighting), 40 years old (Trinity Art Shows), 145 years old (our beautiful building), over 200 years old (our American Book of Common Prayer), and over 2000 years old (the Incarnation of our Lord.)

8.) *We are Responsible* – Our Church, and our parish family needs us to step up and be responsible for what we have been given in faith. We are also responsible to persons in our communities, to newcomers of every race and culture, and ultimately, we are responsible to our Lord Jesus Christ.

Also very popular are the toiletries found in the bathrooms of hotels and motels. Shampoo, conditioner, body and hand lotions just fly off the shelves at the CFP, as do toothbrushes and toothpaste (have you priced toothpaste recently? Yikes!) If you are traveling this summer and can do so, please bring home those toiletry extras you don’t use!

For the first four months of 2018, CFP provided 30, 583 meals in about 10,759 pounds of food distributed. That’s a lot of food!
