


I'm off to Camp Washington again this year for a week in the Wilderness Adventure program. I'll be away from July 14 – 19. This is my fourth year as chaplain of the Wilderness kids, and the first year that I won't have a grandson in the pro-

gram. That will make things a little easier, I think!

There will be two Wilderness camps; one for the younger kids (ages 8-12) and one for the teens (ages 13-15). One of my challenges is to go between the two camps and be a chaplain to both groups. The camps are about a half mile apart. A path through the woods connects the two.

Each year Camp Washington chooses a theme for the summer. One of the camp counselors is tasked with being the Christian Formation leader to help implement the theme. This year the topic is taken from Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's **Way of Love**. Joshua Brown is a new camp counselor and will be the religious facilitator. He's a very nice young man from the New Haven area and will help with the religious services and education for the whole summer.



Each day at camp we have Morning Prayer which is called "Wake up, Shake up" and Compline which is REALLY needed to get everyone quieted down and ready for bed. I'll lead some of these services, and I'll encourage the kids to take leadership roles too. At the end of the week we'll have a Eucharist at the beautiful outdoor chapel with all the cabin campers.

Have a camp experience yourself here in the midst of civilization! There is a podcast with interviews of the Bishop and reflections by two others about the **Way** of **Love**.

There is beautiful music on the podcast too by Ana Hernandez. I recommend that you check out the podcasts! Wherever you usually get your podcasts just search for *The Way of Love with Bishop Michael Curry*. They make a lovely

morning meditation for anyone, any place, anytime!

We all need a reminder to return to our spiritual practices that we may have put aside over time. You may not be going into the wilderness this summer, but I would ask you to consider taking a few minutes to **Turn**, **Learn**, **Pray**, **Worship**, **Bless**, **Go and Rest** each day, week and month this summer. Give it a try!
